


Kent Langabeer

Kent Charles Langabeer, 75, passed away peacefully on March 15, 2015, due to causes related to Parkinson's Disease.

He was born in Seattle, Wash. on April 8, 1939 to Kent E. and Margaret Langabeer. He



graduated from Edmonds High School in 1957. After completing his accounting degree at the University of Washington ('61), he began a life-long career in public accounting, eventually establishing his own firm, Langabeer, McKernan, Burnett and Co. with offices in Everett, Marysville and Stanwood, Wash. He very much enjoyed working with his many clients, and missed them after his retirement in 2009.

Kent was a long-time member and past president of the Marysville Noon Rotary, served as a board member for several organizations including Cascade Land Conservancy (now Forterra), Senior Services of Snohomish County, Private Industry Council of Snohomish County, Alternative School Advisory Board and First Presbyterian Church. In his spare time he enjoyed gardening, especially growing vegetables and dahlias at his homes at Lake Stickney, Priest Point and finally in North Everett. He and Julie traveled frequently to Hawaii, and to a number of other places in the world. The most adventurous was an 18 day trip through the Grand Canyon in a wooden dory. He cherished time with family at his rustic cabin near the Sauk River, hiking, fishing and cooking on the wood stove.

He is survived by his wife of 48 years, Julie Langabeer; his daughter, Sally (Allen) Price; his former daughter-in-law, Katie (Jeff) Grimm; and his beloved grandchildren, Austin, Alex, Colby and Madison; his brother, Richard (Jacqui); his niece, Brenna (Erik); nephew, Jamie (Aimee); several cousins and a large extended family. He was preceded in death by his parents and his son, Michael. The family is grateful to Kent's wonderful caregiver, Barbara Locantore, who has been a great help for the past year and a half.

A memorial service is planned for 11:30 a.m. on Friday March 27, 2015 at the First Presbyterian Church, 2936 Rockefeller Ave, Everett, WA. A reception will immediately follow.
